BOX-GUM GRASSY WOODLAND WEED CONTROL:

Expression of interest for weed control in Box-Gum Grassy Woodlands on the Merriwa Plateau

Hunter Local Land Services (LLS) are seeking expressions of interest (EOIs) from land managers with remnant Box-Gum Grassy Woodlands (BGGW) on their properties to undertake targeted weed control works. BGGW is critically endangered nationally and in NSW, having been reduced to only 5% of its original range in NSW. This project aims to improve the condition and resilience of remnant BGGW by reducing weed threats and promoting regeneration of native species. The project is targeting areas within the Merriwa Plateau which contain remnant BGGW. This project is supported by a multi-year weed action plan with funding from MACH Energy.

Eligible activities include:

- Weed control in remnant Box-Gum Grassy Woodland
- Small-scale revegetation to protect or enhance existing remnant vegetation, or link areas of remnant vegetation to improve connectivity.

The project is prioritising the following weeds on the Merriwa Plateau:

- Fireweed
- Patersons curse
- Opuntioid species (Prickly pear, Tiger pear etc)
- Honey locust
- African olive
- Coolatai grass

- Blackberry
- Spiny burr grass
- Green cestrum
- African boxthorn
- St Johns WortBlue heliotrope
- Noogoora burr

Successful applicants will be allocated professional contractor resources to undertake nominated works. This will be funded and coordinated by Hunter LLS. Contractors will also be available to provide best practice weed management advice to landholders. Allocation of contractors will be determined on an individual basis, based on EOIs received and approval by Hunter LLS.

All successful applicants will be required to prepare and submit a weed management and/or revegetation plan prior to commencement of work

This project will not provide services for fencing, farm infrastructure, capital equipment or works that have already been funded through an existing funding agreement with LLS or CMA.

Eligibility criteria

To be eligible for support, projects must meet the following criteria:

- Project site must be within the Merriwa plateau
- Project site must contain remnant BGGW
- Proposals must be for the listed priority weeds or revegetation/planting using local native species only
- Where revegetation is proposed, stock must be excluded from the project site with temporary or permanent fencing (or evidence provided that it will be fenced out)



- Applicant must develop and implement a property weed management plan or revegetation plan (or both) prior to works commencing (to be developed with the assistance of Hunter LLS)
- Applicant must have completed all works, including reporting or monitoring, for any previously funded projects with Hunter LLS
- Proposed works must not already be required to be undertaken under an existing project or project maintenance clause
- Applicant must be willing to enter an access agreement with Hunter LLS to authorise contractor and staff access
- Applicant must be willing to monitor and maintain project works for a 3-year period following completion (including ongoing weed suppression, stock exclusion, maintain 70% survival of plants)
- The proposed activities must be consistent with local, NSW and Australian government regulations and legislation
- Applicant must hold \$10 million public liability insurance
- Applicant must have paid all Hunter LLS financial obligations
- All proposed works must be completed by 30 November 2022 (or otherwise agreed timeframe)

Assessment process

This expression of interest form does not guarantee funding allocation. All submissions will be reviewed and prioritised against the following criteria:

- Density and type of weeds present
- Evidence of previous weed control attempts (or new incursion of a weed)
- Presence and diversity of existing BGGW vegetation
- Evidence of natural regeneration of BGGW species
- Overall condition and connectivity of riparian asset

All proponents will receive notification from Hunter LLS on the outcome of their application. Hunter LLS will liaise with successful applicants and contractors to coordinate on-ground works.
