To whom it may concern,

I am a farmer from Victoria and recently bought land up in the Clarence Valley. I am amazed at how little locals are concerned about the uniqueness of the Clarence valley and its amazing biodiversity. It seems to be taken for granted yet there are a number of endangered species present I'm sure you have numerous submissions so I'm concentrating briefly on three issues.

- 1. If farmers could be paid biodiversity credits to maintain trees especially old ones this would make a huge difference to land clearing. I see areas cleared and in many situations it's such poor farming country!
- 2.. When fencing there is absolutely no need to have such a wide area either side of the new boundary fence. 3 -5 metre would be totally adequate and Old growth trees need to be maintained. That's what I've done and a tractor can freely move it her side of the fence line.
- 3. I'm also doing cool burning (cultural) and this method certainly needs to be encouraged. This will be my third year
